



## 2016-17 Baker College Prep Promotion Criteria

All Noble Street Charter School campuses require students to meet rigorous promotion criteria so that students are academically, socially, and physically prepared for admission into their best match colleges and to be successful in and beyond college. To be promoted to the next grade, Baker College Prep scholars must meet **ALL 6** of the requirements detailed here.

### #1: Academics

Students must earn the credits from all classes in which they are enrolled during the regular school day and school year. Any student who fails any class will be expected to enroll in make-up classes at Baker College Prep in order to recover the credits at the next available opportunity. Students unable to make up all credits before the following school year starts will not be promoted to the next grade.

For this school year, the cost for the make-up courses will be as follows:

*\*Half Credit course price for 2016 Night School and Summer School has been changed to \$100/class.*





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Note: Course fees are used to pay teachers for the extra hours they have to work in order to help students recover lost credits, and be promoted.

### **Transfer Students**

A student wishing to transfer into Baker College Prep must present an official transcript for evaluation. To transfer in at her/his current level, (s)he must have recovered credit for all failed courses at the previous school. If time allows, a student can be offered night school or summer school to recover any credit needed to remain at the current grade level. If a student has failed more than 1.5 credits worth of classes, (s)he can be offered enrollment at the lower grade level if space allows.



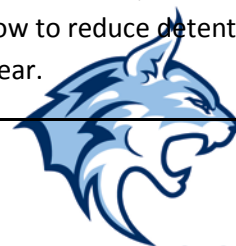
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## #2: Discipline

Students must demonstrate discipline and maturity to be promoted. Within any one school year, if a student receives the number of detentions below, the student must face the corresponding consequences

Number of Detentions	Consequence
0 - 12 detentions	The student may be promoted as long as the student serves all detentions.
13 - 24 detentions*	The student may not be promoted or graduate unless he/she takes a discipline class to remove detentions 13 through 24. All detentions must be served.  <b>The course costs \$140.</b>
25-47 detentions*	The student may not be promoted or graduate unless he/she takes an additional discipline class to remove detentions 25 through 47. All detentions must be served.  <b>The course costs \$140.</b>
48+ detentions	Any student who has over 48 detentions at the end of the year will be on disciplinary probation the following year if they serve all detentions and take all required behavior classes before the following school year. This means they will not be promoted onto the next grade. The student may be able to earn her/ his way back into the following grade level if certain specific, rigorous behavior requirements are met the following year. The specifics of probationary promotion will be provided to students for whom this applies
Note on discipline	If a student is able to reduce their overall detention count, he or she will be exempt from serving their discipline class. Details of how to reduce detention counts will be provided to parents and students during the year.





### #3: Community Service

Community service must be completed at a non-profit, charitable organization. Hours at for-profit organizations and non-profit organizations for which a family member works will be automatically denied. Community service hours must be submitted for approval through our online form within **7 school days of the service date** and hours will be counted once the information in the online form is verified. Our Community Service Coordinator will confirm that date/hours worked are correct and that the volunteer work was done at an approved location.

There will be a **\$70 fee** for any student who does not meet the community service deadline on time. This fee is used to pay a community service coordinator over the summer to check, process, and log community service hours that were not done by the deadline.

\*It is recommended that students submit their community service hours two weeks prior to the deadline. This will ensure if the submission does not meet the specifications and is rejected then the student will still have time to make up those hours before the deadline.

#### Transfer Students

A student wishing to transfer into Baker College Prep must complete all Community Service hours that (s)he did not complete during the previous years. If a student completed hours at her/ his previous school, (s)he must submit documentation of these hours by the first upcoming semester deadline for approval. If approved, these hours will count toward the student's total.





### Community Service Requirements and Deadlines

9	Minimum total of 5 approved hours by Semester 1 deadline, minimum total of 10 approved hours at 2+ sites by Semester 2 deadline.
10	Minimum total of 20 approved hours at 2+ sites by Semester 1 deadline, minimum total of 30 approved hours at 2+ sites by Semester 2 deadline.  <b>Transfer students:</b> Students must meet the same requirements as all other students in the same grade level by <b>August 11<sup>th</sup> 2017</b> . (meaning they must catch up on hours and site requirements missed during 9 <sup>th</sup> grade). They must complete a minimum of 10 hours at 1 site by the Semester 1 deadline to avoid Night School.
11	Minimum total of 40 approved hours at 2+ sites by Semester 1 deadline, minimum total of 50 approved hours at 2+ sites by Semester 2 deadline  <b>Transfer students:</b> Students must meet the same requirements as all other students in the same grade level by <b>August 11<sup>th</sup> 2017</b> . (meaning they must catch up on hours and site requirements missed during 9 <sup>th</sup> and 10 <sup>th</sup> grade). They must complete a minimum of 10 hours at 1 site by the Semester 1 deadline to avoid Night School.
12	Minimum total of 60 approved hours at 2+ sites by Semester 1 deadline, minimum total of 70 approved hours at 2+ sites by Semester 2 deadline.

### Semester Deadlines

Semester 1 - Friday, 1/13 at 5:15 PM

Semester 2 - Monday, 6/12 at 5:15 PM

Semester 2 Seniors—Friday, 5/26 at 5:15pm. This due to Seniors graduating earlier than school ends for other students.





## #4: Enrichment

Students must earn the following number of enrichment credits (taken outside the regular school schedule) to be promoted or to graduate. Students earn enrichment credit at Baker by completing their participation in that enrichment activity (a minimum of 25 hours is required, though some activities will require additional hours to be considered complete). Each enrichment activity taken at Baker College Prep costs \$25. Students will not be issued credit for their enrichment until the fee is paid. This fee is used to pay enrichment instructors.

Outside enrichment activities will be accepted for credit at Baker with the following documentation provided (Sem. 1 Deadline: Tues, 1/13/17 at 5:15pm, Sem. 2 Deadline: Mon, 6/12/17 at 5:15pm)

- Letter from organization must be printed on organization letterhead.
- Letter includes the total number of hours of the activity that the student completed (must be 25 hours or more), including the dates and times of the activity meetings.
- Letter includes contact information for the enrichment activity leader (name, job title, phone number, and email address)
- Letter includes a description of the enrichment activity the student completed (what was taught and what was learned)





Grade Level	Requirement
9	0.25 enrichment credit
10	0.50 total enrichment credit  <b>Transfer students:</b> A student who transfers in must meet the same requirement as other students in the same grade level, meaning they must make up the enrichment credit from 9 <sup>th</sup> grade. Students must meet this deadline by <b>August 11<sup>th</sup> 2017</b> . This allows students time during the summer to make up hours if needed.
11	0.75 total enrichment credit  <b>Transfer students:</b> A student who transfers in must meet the same requirement as other students in the same grade level, meaning they must make up the enrichment credit from 9 <sup>th</sup> and 10 <sup>th</sup> grade. Students must meet this deadline by <b>August 11<sup>th</sup> 2017</b> . This allows students time during the summer to make up hours if needed.
12	1 total enrichment credit

Students who fail to meet the enrichment requirement during the school year must complete an enrichment activity over the summer in order to be promoted. Students may take academic summer school courses for enrichment credit for \$25 per class.





## #5: Health and Fitness

### Fitness Test Requirements

\*All students must pass grade level health and fitness benchmarks in order to be promoted

#### **9th and 10th grade students**

Must attain the benchmark score OR the growth goal for all three tests (see tables below).

Students may “mix and match”-i.e. hit the growth goal for two tests and the benchmark score for one test or vice-versa.

#### **11th and 12th grade students**

Must reach the benchmark on all three Physical Test measures (push-up, curl-up, 1 mile run) for their respective grade level in order to be promoted. Note: 10th grade transfer students and students who did not take the 9th grade Post Physical test will have growth determined by the 10th grade Pre Physical Test.

### Health Assessment Requirements

The Noble Health Content Assessment is a test consisting of multiple choice questions created from the Noble Health and Fitness Standards. There is a 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grade test with 50 multiple choice questions each. Each standard bucket below will be represented with approximately the same number of questions.

70% or 35/50 is required to pass the Noble Health Content Assessment and only ONE retake is permitted. Students who have an IEP should have their test modified accordingly to their IEP.

### **Support Program for Promotion**

9th- 12th Students who have a BMI of 40 or above (pre-test) are eligible for the Support Program. Students who successfully complete the Support Program will take all Physical Tests, but will not be required to attain the growth or benchmark score on the Post Physical Test for promotion. Successful completion of the program involves completing 50 hours of fitness, nutritional education, and emotional health activities planned by the campus.

\*Both the support program and Noble Fit are free of charge.

### **NobleFit Summer Fitness Program**

Students who do not meet the passing requirements on the Post Fitness Test or Post Health Content Assessment must complete either a campus-based or centralized summer session. Sessions will be 25 hours of fitness and health education.

Times, locations, and sign-up process for the NobleFit Summer Fitness Program will be given to students at Quarter 4 Report Card Pickup.



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## #6: Attendance

Students who have **more than 20 Noble absences** for any reason (including excused absences, absences as a result of suspension, and an accumulation of instances of tardiness to school) will be required to take a summer school class to be promoted. Please note that four times tardy to school counts as one Noble absence.

The cost of the summer school class for Attendance is \$25. The student will enroll in a summer school academic class of his/her choice to fulfill the attendance requirement.

If a student is taking every academic course offered in Summer School, (s)he will **not** have to take an additional summer class to recover absences. The class fee will be waived and the Attendance promotion requirement will be met by completion of the other classes.



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
